Letter from the Vicar

Dear friends,

Each year, Advent invites us into a season filled with longing and hope. It is a time when the Church asks us to slow down and watch. Not to fill every space with noise and activity, but to listen. Hope, peace, joy and love are traditional themes of Advent for the four Advent Sundays.






Hope, in this context, is not the thin, modern hope that wishes vaguely for better days, but thick, biblical hope that roots itself in God's promises. Hope looks honestly at the world - its fractures, injustices, and griefs - and still dares to say, 'God is coming.' Advent hope is born in darkness, where God's people learn again that light coming is the gift of divine mercy. It is the hope that steadies us when the nights grow long, reminding us that no shadow can extinguish the Light of the World.

Peace is another Advent theme, threaded into each Scripture reading and hymn. It is not simply the absence of conflict, but the deep, reconciling peace that Christ brings: a peace that heals what is broken inside us and between us. It calls us to become peacemakers ourselves, even in small ways: offering forgiveness, choosing gentleness and grace, and sowing kindness into others' lives.



A quiet Joy also emerges in Advent. It is not loud or flashy. It springs from knowing God is near - that Emmanuel, 'God with us', steps into our world, not as a distant ruler but as a child who shares our humanity. This joy is not naive; it still knows sorrow, but it is like the joy and trust Mary knew





Finally, Love stands at the heart of Advent, drawing all the other themes into itself. The season prepares us not only for the birth of Christ long ago, but for the continual birth of God's love in us. It invites us to open our hearts - to Christ, to one another, and to the world God longs to redeem. This is the love that moved God to take on flesh, to dwell among us, and to walk with humanity through every valley and shadow.

Advent is, at its core, a season of holy waiting. Not passive, but expectant. We wait with hope for what God will do. We seek peace in a world aching for it. We choose joy, even in uncertainty. We practice love that reflects the very heart of Christ. May this Advent season draw us deeper into God's story, and help prepare us to welcome the Christ-child once more.

Eco Tip: Travelling Light



As we dream of warmer days and holidays next year, here are some travel tips, with thanks to National Geographic. The most effective way to reduce carbon emissions of travelling is to reduce the distance travelled and to travel in a way that burns less or, even better, no fossil fuels, using more sustainable modes of transport.



For the time being, the emissions from just one long-haul flight can be more than those caused by someone driving a standard petrol car for a whole year. Cruise ships have even higher emissions per passenger than aircraft. Taking the train within the UK emits about six times less than flying and taking the

bus or coach emits about nine times less. In Europe, where many trains (including Eurostar) are electric, the emissions from rail travel can be as much as 10 times less than flying.





If you do fly, you can use online tools such as the 'lower CO2e' filter on trip results provided by flight search engines like <u>Skyscanner</u> and <u>Opodo</u>, which flags up those flights that have less than average emissions.

Results of the Charity Voting at St John's

Thanks to all who nominated and voted for charities that St John's will support this year.
