There is no need to worry, but do not give anyone, including our Vicar, any personal information, including bank details. The current ones seem to be about 'buying some Amazon vouchers online and sending to this email address of a friend suffering from cancer and I will refund you

when I am back'. Do ignore all such messages. Don't reply, and report it if you know how to. This stuff is very hard to avoid, but if you always check the email address the message has come from, that should help. Sometimes it appears very close to the real one, so do just take care. If you think you have been hacked, the best thing is to change your password immediately. It doesn't always mean you have to change your email address.

FLOWERS IN CHURCH We all like seeing flowers in Church each week but there are less people on the 'flower team' now for various health reasons so we really need to have more people to provide and arrange a vase of flowers for the front table under the Banner, and a small vase on the sanitizer table, even once or twice a year would be helpful. Some flowers like Carnations, Alstroemeria, Chrysanthemums, last 2-3 weeks. If you don't feel up to arranging but could supply some money to buy them occasionally, even once a year, that would be marvellous, and we can arrange for someone to arrange them for you.
