If paying by cash or cheque, make cheques out to **St John the Baptist PCC**, put the cash / cheque in an envelope marked 'Manager Parish Buildings Fund' and hand to a churchwarden / the office. If you would like to pay by BACs, the church account details are below, but PLEASE hand an envelope into the office or to a churchwardens which states how much you have given, again clearly marking the envelope 'Manager Parish Building Fund' so we know that is what the donation is for. **Sort code 30-96-73, account number 02328599, account name St John the Baptist PCC. Please put your surname as the reference.** In all these cases, if you pay tax, please fill in a gift aid form so that we can reclaim the tax. It increases your giving by 25% without any additional cost to yourself. Thank you!
